

AdSAFE Ltd (AdSAFE) is an independent service providing a centralised and consistent service for the protection of children and vulnerable persons for the Seventh-day Adventist Church across parts of the South Pacific Division. AdSAFE contributes to the mission of the Church by enabling children and vulnerable people to experience the love of God in a safe and secure church related environment.

AdSAFE's principal objective, endorsed by the Seventh-day Adventist Church, is to implement preventative strategies to mitigate the risk of abuse against children and vulnerable people within the Seventh-day Adventist Church. It is broken down into some distinct areas which include:

- Providing support, justice and restorative pathways for survivors of abuse and their families, including management of a redress scheme
- Implementing preventative strategies to mitigate the risk of abuse against children and vulnerable people
- The ongoing development, review, implementation and support of policies to address legislative and regulatory requirements and other best practice strategies
- Training for all Seventh-day Adventist Church denominational employees and volunteers in leadership and child related roles
- Coordinating independent investigations into allegations about the conduct of employees and volunteers as it relates to abuse against children and vulnerable people.
- Implementing appropriate risk management strategies around the attendance of persons of concern and known offenders
- Screening of employees and volunteers
- Providing professional advice and support on all of the above matters to our stakeholders
